The key learning outcome of Seminar 2 is to improve your note-taking skills through practising two different methods of effective note-taking.

Home exercise instructions

1. Open the academic article .pdf attached to the email.

2. As you are reading the article, please do take notes exactly as you would normally do when reading articles or books when preparing for your assignments in the past.

Don't spend more or less time on this task than you normally would. Just imagine you're doing this reading for one of your essays!

3. Copy paste your notes in a word document and email it to me by Thursday morning.

The Thursday seminar will start with sharing some of your notes anonymously. We will compare and discuss them together. After this exercise, I'll present different note-taking techniques. I will detail and demonstrate two different techniques of efficient note-taking that will help you in your essay and dissertation preparation. The final part of the seminar will be a live demonstration of note-taking on a longer academic article.
